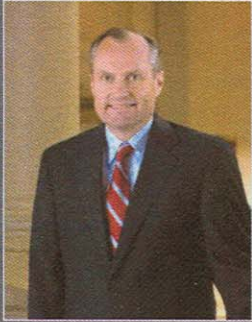


Transportation Relief in Sight

VOTER'S DECIDE

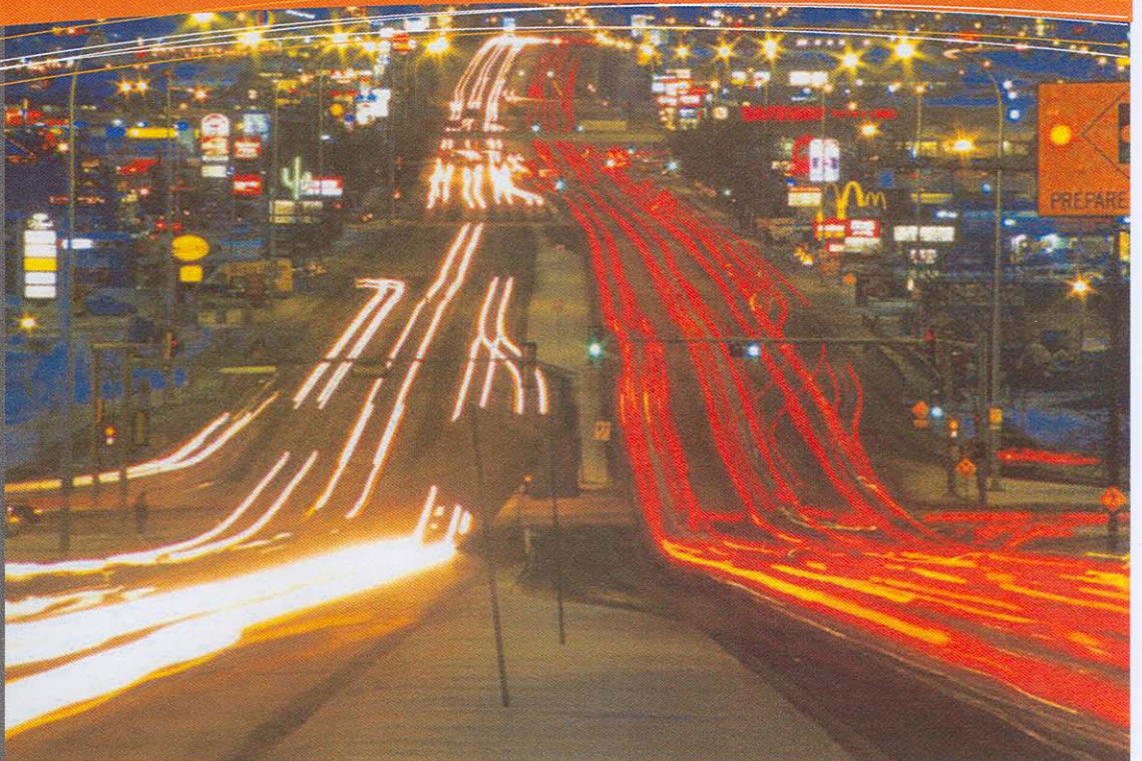
This plan provides a voice to citizens and local leaders who are more in tune with their area's needs in order to shape a truly needed transportation solution.

Metro Atlanta's region will consist of the 10 - county Atlanta Regional Commission, and the rest of state will be allowed to form regions as small as a county or larger depending on local needs.

Only five days remain in the 2009 legislative session, and I want to take a moment today to give you an update on the current status of our regional transportation plan to address transportation needs throughout our state. As you are well aware, our state has been crippled for years by poor transportation planning. And while the metro-area has the second worst gridlock in the nation, our entire state continues to suffer from poor infrastructure development, stalled project development and wasted resources. Our state must provide local communities, large and small, with the tools for success. I believe this plan will make this goal a reality.

I am joined by economic leaders from around the state in supporting this proven method of alleviating our problem.

Today marks the second time the Senate has overwhelmingly supported the plan and it will only take one more simple step to be placed on the Governor's desk - a simple "agree" from the House. If the House agrees to our position, we will have a meaningful transportation plan, vetted by economic leaders of Georgia, proven by a history of success in other states, and finally providing families with a chance to spend more time at home and less time on the road. Don't let the General Assembly in Atlanta gridlock the transportation needs of Georgia. Please join me in giving the "green light" to less congestion and offering a true solution to address our state's transportation woes.
